Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Whenever I hear today's first reading, I always feel a failure. It all sounds so perfect. This is the Church as it is meant to be: faithful to prayer and worship, active in the world, making a difference to those around them, conscious to the needs of other and gladly responding to those needs. All of this flows from the Breaking of the Bread, the Eucharist. Then I remind myself that there were also arguments and ambition; fall outs and factions; selfishness and self-promotion. It always has been and always will be because of the human element in the Church. We have always to remember that it's not our Church. It doesn't belong to us; it belongs to Jesus. He knows what he is doing.

The image of the Church that we contemplate in the first reading this Sunday is complemented and completed by the Gospel account of the disciples in a fearful huddle in the Upper Room. Christ stands in their midst and offers them the gift of His peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. These gifts transform and renew the disciples, making them apostles - people who are sent with a mission. Even Thomas' doubts can't stifle the presence and power of the Risen Lord. We are learning that the Church is a connection of love (with God and one another), not a building; a lifestyle, not just a weekly activity (the lifestyle flows from the weekly activity) and an act of service, not just a service to attend.

In the midst of the anxiety and fear, remember that He still stands among us and offers us His peace and the transforming power of the Spirit and that, while the buildings might be empty, the Church is still full of people and still responsive to His promptings.

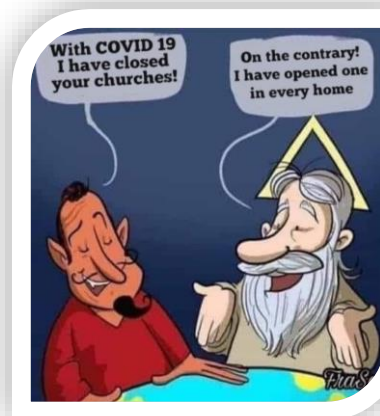
