World Mission Sunday is a day set aside for the Church throughout the world to publicly renew its commitment to the missionary movement. It is celebrated on the next-to-last Sunday of October every year. It was created by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer for missions.

The Second Vatican Council’s Decree on Mission, clearly states the mission of the Church in the world. “The Church has been divinely sent to all nations that she might be ‘the universal sacrament of salvation.’ The very nature of the Church is missionary and she is summoned by Christ with urgency to bring the message of Christ to the four corners of the world.

We believe that our mandate to bring the "good news" to all people constitutes the essential mission of the church. Clearly given to it by Jesus himself at the Ascension: "Go therefore making disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." – Matthew 28:19-20

FIRST READING A reading from the prophet Isaiah (45:1.4-6)

Thus says the Lord to his anointed, to Cyrus,
whom he has taken by his right hand
to subdue nations before him
and strip the loins of kings,
to force gateways before him
that their gates be closed no more:

It is for the sake of my servant Jacob,
of Israel my chosen one,
that I have called you by your name,
conferring a title though you do not know me.
I am the Lord, unrivalled;
there is no other God besides me.
Though you do not know me, I arm you
that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun
that, apart from me, all is nothing. **The word of the Lord.**

SECOND READING A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians (1:1-5)

From Paul, Silvanus and Timothy, to the Church in Thessalonika which is in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ; wishing you grace and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We always mention you in our prayers and thank God for you all, and constantly remember before God our Father how you have shown your faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope, in our Lord Jesus Christ.

We know, brothers, that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when we brought the Good News to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit and as utter conviction. **The word of the Lord.**

Alleluia, alleluia! Your word is truth, O Lord, consecrate us in the truth. Alleluia!

GOSPEL A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew (22:15-21)

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not? But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this?' Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God' **The Gospel of the Lord.**
