### Holy Communion

While lockdown is slowly eased, nonetheless we need to continue to observe some restrictions as we come together to celebrate Holy Mass with particular regard to its conclusion. While I understand it feels as if Mass is ended yet I must remind you that although we have the final blessing before we receive Holy Communion we are still in the presence of Our Lord and as such should take this time for quiet reflection before coming forward to receive the Sacrament and not hold conversations with each other.

A simple rule of thumb – **Mass finishes when you leave the building or when the Blessed Sacrament is returned to the Tabernacle.**

Once you have received the Eucharist, you should leave the Church quietly and not speak to anyone until you are out into the Church grounds. Even when outside, and to keep everyone safe and well, please remember to observe social distancing.



**FIRST READING:** A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit. **The word of the Lord.**

**R. You, Lord, are my praise in the great assembly.**

**GOSPEL** A reading from the holy Gospel according to John (15:1-8)

Jesus said to his disciples:

and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes  
to make it bear even more.  
You are pruned already,  
by means of the word that I have spoken to you.  
Make your home in me, as I make mine in you.  
As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself,  
but must remain part of the vine,  
neither can you unless you remain in me.  
I am the vine, you are the branches.  
Whoever remains in me, with me in him,  
bears fruit in plenty;  
for cut off from me you can do nothing.  
Anyone who does not remain in me  
is like a branch that has been thrown away  
- he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on  
the fire, and they are burnt.  
If you remain in me and my words remain in you,  
you may ask what you will and you shall get it.  
It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much  
fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
