In the Gospel, Jesus reminds the people around him of two great commandments in the Old Testament. The scribe is doing what many Jews like to do - talking about their faith and trying to understand it better.

He is very pleased when Jesus quotes from the Book of Deuteronomy - one of the oldest books in the Bible. "You will love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength and love your neighbour as yourself."

Jesus sees that the scribe is beginning to understand what the kingdom of God is about.

Prayer


Lord Jesus, you give us two simple rules for living - to love God and to love each other.
