THE ADVENT SEASON

In Advent the Church begins to prepare celebrate Jesus' birth by looking forward to Christ's second coming at the end of time. The dominant note is one of joyful hope.

Advent I – The lighting of the Advent wreath is an opportunity to reflect on Christ our Light as he shines through the Gospel of Mark, the gospel predominantly used throughout this coming year.

Advent II - The Second Sunday in Advent is slightly different (in Musselburgh) this year as the 10^{th} is the feast of Our Lady of Loretto

From 17 December we begin to prepare for Christmas where Christ is presented as fulfilling the hope of Israel.

Advent III - This year the 17th falls on the 3rd Sunday or Gaudete Sunday. After Mass the **Children will decorate the Christmas Tree** and have their last meeting before Christmas.

It is my duty as your pastor to encourage you to prepare spiritually. The birth of the Lord is best celebrated by allowing him into our lives – he is born again into our hearts; we are born again into his life. Therefore, I must offer to you and encourage you to use the Sacrament of Reconciliation

At 4.00pm on Advent III Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be celebrated and during this an opportunity access to the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available

Advent IV – Sunday Masses on 23/24 December will be short without homily or music. This will allow us to quietly complete Advent before Christmas begins.
